### Daily Mile Launch

Simply put, The Daily Mile is 15 minutes where in children jog or run, at their own pace, during the school day at a time of the teacher's choosing. It's a simple and straightforward initiative that has been acknowledged for reducing childhood obesity and recognised within the UK Government's 2018 Childhood Obesity Strategy.
